



2012 USA Wildwater Nationals/Wyoming Whitewater Championships May 25-27 - Jackson, Wyoming

The Jackson Hole Kayak Club is excited to bring USA Wildwater to Wyoming for the first time, especially on the national stage. This year's Nationals will be incorporated into the 16th Annual Wyoming Whitewater Championships, the JHKC's fundraising kayak festival. Information for Racers

Registration:

-In person, Friday, May 25th OR [download a registration form and USACK release waiver](#) and email it to event director Brent Tyc at brent@jhkayakclub.org by Wednesday, May 23rd

-Entry fee (includes all WWC events and the film festival Friday night): **\$50 (\$35** if coming from farther than 10 hour drive)

-This is a USA Canoe & Kayak sanctioned event so all competitors must sign a USACK release waiver whether or not you are USACK member already

Race Format:

-We will be following ICF and USAC/USA Wildwater guidelines. There will be two days of races: a classic 10k lasting approximately 12-15 minutes and 2-400m sprints lasting 45-90 seconds each. All racers will be required to have at least: ICF approved boat flotation, PFD, helmet and booties. To view all ICF Wildwater rules, click [here](#).

Courses:

-**The Sprint** on the Snake River will be through the new Double Draw rapid, a steep wide wave train formed from a landslide in 2011. Starting at the Taco Hole river access racers will sprint across open, flatwater before approaching the Double Draw horizon. After Double Draw the river narrows and bends slightly left with a sharp right fast approaching, watch out for HairCut Rock, then finish strong through some eddy line boils.

-**The Classic** will take place on the Hoback River, which flows into the Snake 15 miles upstream of the sprint course. The Hoback has lower volume and a narrower channel than the Snake with the course winding through some tight Class II and III rapids. A couple of S-bends will challenge racers choice of lines.

-Flows on the Hoback average from 500-1000 cfs in late-May while the Snake averages 4000-8000cfs. River access and practice will be unlimited with light river traffic to be expected on the Snake with almost no river traffic on the Hoback. In late-May you can definitely count on **cold water** as well.

Boats and Borrowing One:

Travel Info:

-Jackson is located in Northwest Wyoming. The Jackson Hole Airport has consistent jet service to/from Denver and Salt Lake City. Seasonal routes connect directly to Chicago, Dallas, Atlanta and LA as well. Depending on your route you may or may not be able to carry your boat. The Idaho Falls airport (check Allegiant Air for cheap rates) is 90 miles west (~2hr drive) and Salt Lake City airport is ~300 miles to the southwest (5hrs drive).

Lodging/Camping:

-There are plenty of hotel options including national chains in the town of Jackson. Helpful links <http://www.jacksonholechamber.com/lodging/>

-A group campsite has been arranged for at the **West Table** boat ramp, [map here](#), on the Snake River. At the bottom of the hill turn right on the dirt road. Camping is allowed at the end of the cul-de-sac and on the right side of the meadow (please do not camp next to the river). Up to 100 people are permitted to camp here for free so please contact Brent Tyc at brent@jkhayakclub.org to reserve a spot. You can put on the river next to this site and enjoy an easy 5-10 minute paddle to the sprint start. This is a somewhat developed site with picnic tables and charcoal grills and there is only one established fire ring. Please use the porto-toilets we will have setup or walk to the boat ramp bathrooms. The small town of Alpine is 12 miles downstream and has full amenities. Hoback Junction is 15 miles upstream with a gas station and small grocery store, while Jackson is 30 miles upstream.
